These events are designed through 'Aspire' and aim to develop specific sports skills. They are designed to challenge the children and increase their motivation and teamwork.



We are delighted to share the fantastic achievement of our year 5 and 6 pupils, who recently competed in a **swimming gala**. Through their hard work, determination and teamwork, they secured an impressive **1st place in the North of the city and an outstanding 5th place school in all of Liverpool**. This is an incredible accomplishment, and we are extremely proud of their dedication and the way they represented our school. Well done!



We are very proud of our Year 5/6 pupils who have represented our school this term. Our footballers played in the LSSP World Cup and competed until last 16 out of 45 schools - only conceding 1 goal in the whole tournament!!



Our **Year 5** Children took part in an Aspire Showcase run by the Royal Ballet at North Liverpool Academy. The children created the dance themselves and thoroughly enjoyed participating in the event.



Our y4 children have been working hard in gymnastics completing the **British Gymnastics Rise Program**. 13 of our children represented St John's at an inter school competition held in Norte Dame school.

Holy Week

In the lead up to Easter we have been sharing the stories of what happened to Jesus during Holy Week, the last week of his life. This begun with Year 2 retelling the events of Palm Sunday and Year 5 telling us about when Jesus visited the temple later in the week. Year 3 and 4 shared the stories of Maundy Thursday when Jesus shared the Last supper with his friends and afterwards visited the Garden of Gethsemane where he was arrested. Year 6 retold the events of Good Friday when we remember the story of Jesus' crucifixion. We ended the week listening to the Good News from year 1 about Jesus' resurrection.

- (School Tartan Kilt or Tartan Pinafore white Shirt and a School Tie - *white polo shirt for Infants, they do not wear a tie*)

Girls Summer Uniform

- Yellow gingham summer dress
- St John's cardigan
- White socks may be worn
- Black School Shoes

(Logo optional on cardigans)

Wearing the correct school uniform is a vital part of school life. Our uniform is more than just clothing; it is a symbol of belonging, equality and pride. When children wear their uniform correctly, they demonstrate respect for themselves, their school and the community they are part of.

We therefore expect that all pupils arrive at school each day wearing the full, correct uniform.

This also includes wearing appropriate footwear (plain black school shoes – NOT trainers), and a reminder that items such as jewellery also comply with our school policy (*no hooped or 'dangly' earrings – small retainers are allowed – but not on a day when the children go swimming as the staff at the pool will not allow a child to enter the water with any type of earring in*).

When parents and carers support us with this, it massively helps to maintain consistency, reduces distractions and reinforces a strong sense of St John's identity and pride.

Science Week

As part of Science Week we invited Science Boffins into school to do a whole school assembly and then individual year group workshops. Children in infants had lots of fun making **slime** and our junior children learnt about the different components needed for **fire** to occur and took part in lots of fun experiments!

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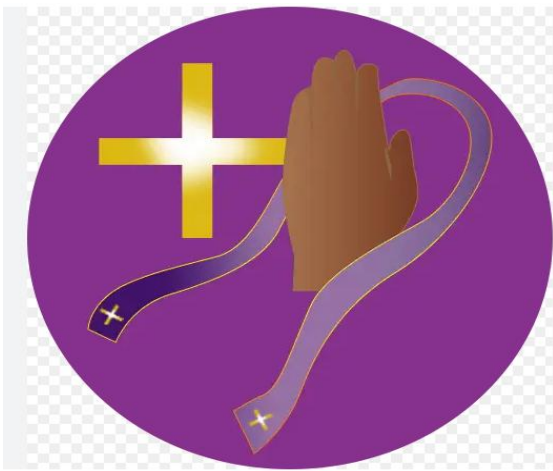

St John's was full of excitement as World Book Day celebrations took over the school!

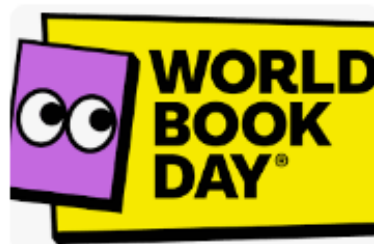
Pupils dressed up as characters from their favourite books to mark the occasion. We spent the day sharing stories and discussing our favourite books.
