Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Watch an episode of numberblocks focussing on numbers 14 and 15- tell a grown up what you noticed. How are numberblocks 14 and 15 made? Can you draw them next to each other? What is the difference between them? • Practice writing numbers 0 -15. The app might help. The app can be downloaded for free. • Make a set of number cards 0-15. Can you order the cards from 0-15. • Mix up your number cards. With a grown-ups help, choose 2 cards, a big number and a small number and add them together. Write a list of your answers. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Choose a reading book on Oxford Owl and read to a grown up. Can you complete the activities? Did you spot any red words? • Build a den indoors or outdoors, tell your teddy or doll the story of The Three Little Pigs. Don't forget to change your voice for each of the characters. • What if The Three Little Pigs were not pigs and the Big Bad Wolf was not a wolf? Retell the story changing the characters. Tell your grown-up the story. • Share a bedtime story with your grown –ups each night.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Write 4 short sentences using the red words my, you, the, said. Can you read the sentences aloud to your grown-ups? • Play fishy phonics on phonics bloom. Start with phase 2 and select an easy or hard game • https://www.phonicsbloom.com/uk/game/fishy-phonics?phase=2 • Play a game of 'eye spy' in your home or when you are out on a walk. Try and use some of the sounds we have learnt during our phonics lessons. For example "I spy something beginning with 'sh'shop". • Keep practising your blending with the games on phonics play. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • After The Three Little Pigs had got rid of the Big Bad Wolf, they enjoyed living together in the brick house. - To attract spiders and beetles put lots of wood in your bug house.


Den Building

Teacher tips

Let the children lead their learning, if they are interested in a particular thing let them explore it and where possible make links with other things as children learn more if they enjoy it.

In Early Years a lot of learning is done through purposeful play, so please don't worry if your child is just 'playing'- encourage them to talk about what they are doing. They will be developing a number of skills through their play, such as speech and language, imagination, fine and gross motor and creativity.

Breaks are important- Children cannot concentrate for long periods of time and need to have time built in for them to switch off. Try PE with Joe wicks or Cosmic Yoga on YouTube to get the children moving and enable them to burn off some energy.
