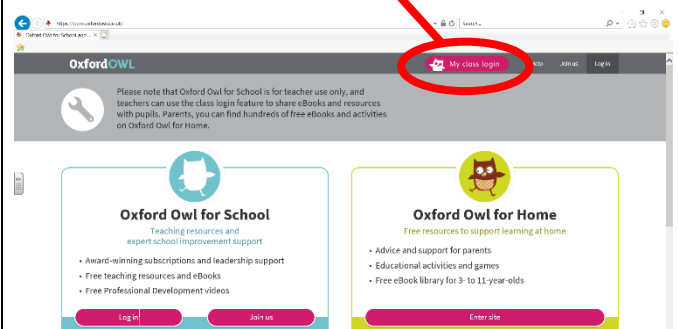

* Write a summary of your book (beginning, middle and end).

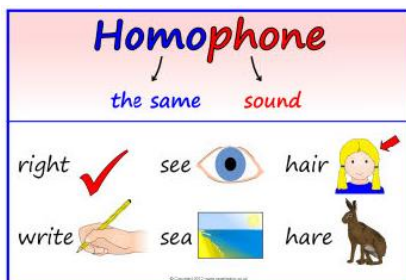
* Draw a picture of the main character and write adjectives (words to describe them) around it.

Weekly Writing tasks

Topic: ADVERTS

Activity 1. While watching TV write down the **slogans** for different adverts, for example 'This is how we do it' for the NATWEST advert with the little girl and her £1 coin.

Then design a poster displaying your slogans and decorate it with icons from the adverts.

Activity 2. Again while watching adverts, write down adjectives (describing words) for the product in the advert.

Choose some of your adjectives to write a sentence to describe the product. (Remember to use a capital letter and full stop).

High Frequency Words (HFW) Practise spelling these words: should, would, could, he, she, we, me, be

Activity 3. Watch out for or if possible find the NATWEST / 'This is how we do it' advert and on a piece of paper or device write the story of the girl in the advert, give her a name! Describe what she is doing and how she doing it.
