



Reading information from Pictograms

In the zoo they have four different types of animal, **lions**, **sharks**, **ducks** and **tortoises**. The pictogram shows how many of each animals they have.

See if you can answer the questions using the data on the pictogram.



1. How many ducks are there?
2. How many sharks are there?
3. How many animals live in the zoo altogether?
4. The zoo has 3 lions, what else do they have 3 of?
5. How many **more** sharks do they have than lions?
6. How many tortoises and ducks do they have altogether?
7. The zoo gets two more tortoises, how many does it have now?
